



From Pastor Danny...

Grace and peace in the Name and Spirit of Jesus Christ!

What is your new year going to look like? Are you planning on having a “great” year? Is there room in the new year for you to improve your relationships with God and with your neighbors? Is there room in this new year to serve the poor and dispossessed?

Jesus shares these teachings as ways to redirect our focus and attention and how to find “greatness” life:

- A lawyer asked Jesus: “Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?” Jesus said, ‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.’ This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.” (Matthew 22:36-40 – NRSV)
- The disciples asked Jesus, “Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven? He called a child, whom he put among them, and said, ‘Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me.’” (Matthew 18:1-5 -- NRSV)
- After James and John’s mother had requested preferential treatment of her two sons, Jesus said: “You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.” (Matthew 20:25-28 – NRSV)

Jesus said: “The greatest among you will be your servant. All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted.” (Matthew 23:11-12 – NRSV)

Jesus shared many angles of how to approach greatness. From the “Great Commandment” to “Who is the greatest?” Jesus points out that greatness is measured in relationships that love God and neighbors and serve others who are in need. In a culture that prides itself on doing whatever it takes to get ahead, we can learn much from our Savior’s teaching. Greatness is more about who we love and how we love than how we can “make a name for ourselves.”

The 3rd Wednesday of each month we will be serving our neighbors who are in need with a meal, a short time of worship, activities for children and youth, and classes for adults (budgeting, job skill/search coaching, parenting skills, dietary planning, etc...) Our neighbors will have the opportunity to go through our new clothes closet and they will also receive their food boxes for the month. We will also be offering health screenings as well. Our goal in providing these ministries is to love God as we love our neighbors and in doing so we aim to break the cycle of poverty for each of these families.

In this new year my invitation is for us to be more attentive to our relationships. God desires stronger relations with Him and our neighbors (including the poor and dispossessed). This year we can become greater in the kingdom of God by focusing less on ourselves and more on God and our neighbors.

Eager to do Good

Dear Church Family,

You have made my joy complete in your generous outpouring during Advent Conspiracy. Paul writes to Titus:

¹¹ That is the way we should live, because God's grace that can save everyone has come. ¹² It teaches us not to live against God nor to do the evil things the world wants to do. Instead, that grace teaches us to live in the present age in a wise and right way and in a way that shows we serve God. ¹³ We should live like that while we wait for our great hope and the coming of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ. ¹⁴ He gave himself for us so he might pay the price to free us from all evil and to make us pure people who belong only to him—people who are always wanting to do good deeds. Titus 2:11-14 New Century Version (NCV)

Other translations say: *zealous* to do good work; *committed* to good deeds; *enthusiastic* for good deeds. Each of these describes a people who want to share the love of Christ with others. I can think of no better evangelistic outreach than showing in word and deed what it means to be a follower of Christ. Yes Benton, we are zealots for living out our faith!

Although there are times that I would not wish my job on my worst enemy, there are many other times that I rejoice in your spirit of generosity that overflows from hearts of gratitude. Through Tuesday, December 27 we received a total of \$13,858.22 for Advent Conspiracy gifts. In addition to the four designated funds, we also received \$5539.00 to be divided between the four projects which is an additional \$1384.75 to each fund!

- ◆ **Compassion International:**
\$1310.00 + 1384.75= \$2694.75
- ◆ **Heifer Project:**
\$2888.22 + 1384.75= \$4272.97
- ◆ **Red Bird Mission:**
\$351.00 + 1384.75= \$1735.75
- ◆ **Local Outreach:**
\$3670.00 + 1384.75= \$5054.75
- ◆ **Living Water: \$100.00**

I watched as my children and grandchildren opened their cards that said a gift had been given to Heifer International or to our local outreach mission projects. They were eager to know more and I was eager to share with them about this wonderful “conspiracy” to take back Christmas. I had shared earlier with them my desire for them to give to these wonderful causes as my Christmas gift. Frankly, they didn’t understand until they received. I have no doubt that they will enthusiastically embrace the concept next year. One son said “Mom, you can use your gift money for yourself or for Advent Conspiracy.” It was a no-brainer for me. All my needs and many of my wants are being met and for that I give the glory to God and pray that I will continue to be a part of the conspiracy for the rest of my days.

What about you? Do you have an Advent Conspiracy story to share? I would love to hear it!

Applying Bible Principles

We’ve all heard the expression, “Money talks.” That’s true. Money does talk. Oh, not in words or phrases that constitute a language, but money talks. Because it is valuable to us, how we use it communicates volumes to those about us. People tend to spend their money on things that are important to them. With the exception perhaps of taxes, all of us vote with the contents of our purses, wallets and checkbooks concerning what means the most to us.

In fact, we could even go so far as to say that a person who does not spend money on something which is supposedly very important in his or her life really does not place much value on that item or activity. Suppose for a moment that you think “little league” baseball for kids is very important. You talk about it wherever you go. You attend the games. You enroll your own children in the program. But when someone calls you to ask you to be a sponsor of a team, or when someone “passes the hat” at a game to pay for equipment, you refuse to participate.

Would you not agree that an impartial observer of such behavior would conclude correctly that little league baseball really does not mean much to you? Your lack of financial support would outweigh the other positive aspects of your attendance, enthusiasm and participation.

The same thing is true in the spiritual realm. It is one thing to talk about Christianity. It is yet another to demonstrate our faith by how we use the money which God has entrusted to us. And that is especially true in our support of the ministry of Benton United Methodist Church. As someone said recently in one church just before the offering was received, “Lord, in spite of all we say and do, this is what we think of you.”

Or as the Lord Jesus put it, “. . . your light must shine before people, so that they will see the good things you do and praise your Father in heaven” (Matt. 5:16).

Financial Updates

This past year has been one of transitions. I want to thank you for being steadfast in growing our mission and ministry through your generosity.

Building Fund

We are almost to the end of our 3 year Building campaign, “Our Faithful Journey”. We will renegotiate our building loan this spring. In March of 2009, we signed a note for \$1,890,359.01. Today our remaining note is \$1,098,336.51. Thank you for your faithfulness that has allowed us to pay almost \$800,000.00 in principal payments!

Designated Giving

In 2011 we received \$142,000.00 for specific projects ranging from the Shoe ministry, to mission trips, to world disasters, food ministry, souper Saturday, and 80 other special ministry and mission projects. WOW! All these funds have been dispensed in your name to help others in the name of Christ.

General Fund

Every family has to have a budget based on projected income and expenses. Our church family is no different and just like my own household, sometimes unanticipated expenses arise. That is why it is so helpful to have a reserve fund to fall back on when emergencies arise. This year we have received \$ 561,000 to support our ministry and mission to our community and around the world. As of today (December 28, 2011), our expenses have been \$556,000 giving us a \$5000.00 cushion to carry into the New Year along with the \$18,000 already in reserve. Your church leaders and staff have worked diligently to control costs and remain mission minded. As soon as we receive all our pledges, we will have a better idea of how our ministry dollars will be distributed in 2012. It promises to be an exciting year of mission and I pray you will join with the rest of the Benton UMC family in giving your best.

United Methodist Women

The Benton United Methodist Women will host their annual United Methodist Women Sunday on January 15, 2012. Our guest speaker will be Cathy Brewton, an ordained deacon in the United Methodist Church. Cathy founded *Life House Ministries*, whose purpose is to restore human beings to the image of God. *Life House Ministries* focuses on spiritual formation and growth through prayer classes, individual spiritual direction, contemplative worship, and spiritual movement classes. Please make plans to attend church January 15, to hear about, and be inspired by this exciting ministry.

Benton United Methodist Women has two circles that meet each month. The Nightingales circle meets the third Tuesday (January 17, 2012) of every month at 6:30 p.m. The Morning Glories circle meets the third Wednesday (January 18, 2012) of each month at 9:30 a.m. This month, both circles meet in the Eva Smith Room for a program "Prayer and Self-Denial" given by Pat Mosher and light refreshments will be served. All women of the UMC are invited to join us for a time of supportive fellowship.

The purpose of the UMW is to know God, to experience freedom through Jesus Christ, and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the United Methodist Church.

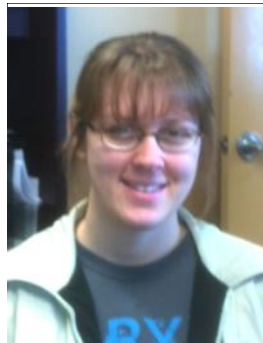
