It’s not just about saving money in this economy; it’s about remembering that when we give presence instead of presents, the real meaning of Christmas has been restored.”

The Advent Conspiracy is a grassroots movement with more than 1,000 churches in 17 countries participating as co-conspirators with projects as varied as drilling a water well for those who lack access to clean water or simply encouraging congregations to think of meaningful acts of kindness as meaningful gift options to replace traditional gifts.

Last year, through Advent Conspiracy, over \$3 Million was raised for relief projects which included providing clean water and medical attention in communities around the world.

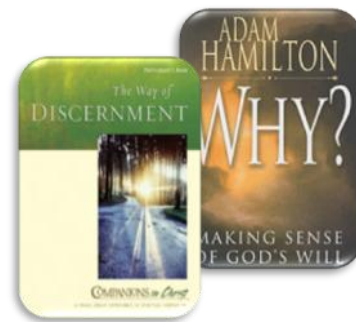
This year, Advent Conspiracy anticipates that individuals and churches will match last year’s commitment to charitable gifts and will make a lasting impact in communities around the world.

In the Midst of Life...

I want to share some words that my son, Rev. Donnie Wilkinson, shared in his last newsletter with his congregation at 1st UMC, Thibodaux. They so elegantly echo my faith statement and I share them so that you too may be encouraged in whatever difficulties you might be experiencing.

"The past few months have been among the most difficult of my life. Many of you who are reading this already know the various trials my family and I have been going through recently but for those who do not know let me bring you up to date.

In May I had surgery to remove a faulty parathyroid gland. Since that surgery I have not been able to speak more loudly than a whisper. Needless to say this has made it nearly impossible for me to do one of the most important aspects of my job as a pastor –to preach and lead worship.

In June April and I learned that our three year old son John Harper has been diagnosed with a form of Muscular Dystrophy. We do not know how severely this will impact his life but is nonetheless heartbreaking for a parent to learn their child has a diagnosis such as this.

On Sunday, July 24, as I was driving to Little Rock, for a series of appointments with the doctor who performed my surgery and a speech pathologist the car my mother was driving hydroplaned off the interstate into the median, hit a number of trees and was totaled. Our eight year old daughter Mollybeth was in the car with her. Thankfully neither of them was severely injured.

As I write this I am awaiting a call from the hospital where I will undergo a procedure to inject my vocal chords with collagen in an effort to help me more fully recover my voice.

I write these words not in an effort to gain sympathy but rather as background so that you, dear reader, better understand my testimony to the grace of God.

Yes, these past few months have been trying but never before have I more persistently experience the power and presence of God.

Time and time again through these past few months I have experienced what St. Paul describes as "the peace that passes all understanding" (*Philippians 4:7*)

Time and time again, as I have waited on the LORD, I have "had my strength renewed" (*Isaiah 40:31*)

Time and time again throughout these months I have been blessed by friends and colleagues who have been Christ to me through their words of encouragement and prayers. Through them I have personally experienced what the author of Lamentations described in 3:22-23:

"The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Through their actions I now more fully understand what it means to be a part of the body of Christ, to have another person bear my burdens in love.

Because of this trying time I now more fully grasp the meaning behind the words the letter of James begins with, "My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing." (*James 1:2-4*)

Yes, these past few months have been trying but because of them I have grown in my faith. Yes, these past few months have been among the most difficult of my life but at the same time they have been among the best. In a way that I cannot fully explain, only testify to, with Christ the worst of times can truly be the best of times."

Applying Bible Principles...

Someone once said, "Experience is a good teacher, but she gives the test first and then the lesson." That's certainly true, and based on many of life's experiences, we frequently fail the test before we can benefit from the lesson.

The formula "e equals mc²" is known by college students but understood by very few people. Most of us know it had something to do with Einstein and was the formula that led to the release of enormous power and to the nuclear age. Similarly, in funding the local church, "e" might stand for every, "m" for member, "c" for commitment, and the "2" for the effort multiplied by itself. The fruit of that kind of effort is much more powerful than what Einstein discovered, even as Jesus described it in Matthew 21:22 — "If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer."

Right now, as we consider the opportunity to support the ministries here at Benton United Methodist Church, God is putting us to the test. As Gordon Moyes stated, "Responsible giving or stewardship is not man's way of raising money, but God's way of raising people. . . .The church's budget is not a list of its expenses, but a record of its vision. It is not a list of bills to be met, but a program of ministry to be achieved."

As each of us prayerfully considers what God would have us give, and as we obey what God asks of us, we can trust Him to provide the resources. That's a test — a test of where we are spiritually much more than where we are financially. It's a test of us as individuals and of us as a church. The question is whether or not we really believe that God has the power and ability to bless our obedience "much more than we can ever ask for, or even think of" (Eph. 3:20).

How are you doing concerning God's tests regarding money in your life? If God's provision in your life in the days ahead depends on how you obey His leading now concerning your giving, what will the future be like for you?

It just might, you know. . . .

Step 3 of a 12 step process of becoming a Christian Steward

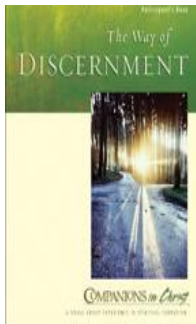
A Christian steward is generous.

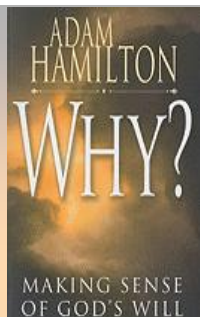

2 Corinthians 5:17

As followers of Christ, God calls us all to live a life of fullness, joy, and service to Him. Jesus called this “abundant life.” Our scripture as a student ministry is 2 Corinthians 5:17 which says, “¹⁷Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!” (NIV). So many people want to know God’s will for their life, what they should be doing with the time God has given. If a person is going to be “IN,” then there are five things they should be living out, and we want to reflect that as a ministry. The first thing is to INvite other people into a relationship with Jesus Christ. Look at what Jesus said in Matthew 28:18-20 “¹⁸Jesus came and told his disciples, “I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰ Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.”

Jesus is very clear that we are supposed to tell people about Him. Most people aren’t doing this because they either don’t know how to do it, are intimidated by it and afraid to mess it up, or honestly don’t care enough to do it. Let’s start with why we should care about telling people about Jesus.

- He said to do it
- People need Him in their life now
- People need to be saved from their sins

Now, in my opinion, most people don’t tell other people about Christ because they are scared of what people will say or are afraid they will “mess it up” and say or do the wrong thing. Take a minute sometime and read Matthew 5:11-12 and Matthew 28:20 and see how Jesus promises to be with you and help you.

Last, so many people are confused about how to actually do it. How to go about telling people about our Lord, Savior, and Friend. Matthew 5:14 makes it clear that it is about our life more than our words. Here’s how your life can tell people about Jesus:

- Treating other people kindly
- Using words that help instead of hurt
- Living a holy lifestyle for others to see

Sometimes, though, you **WILL** need words as well. Here’s how to do that:

- Form a relationship with the person
- Tell them you are a Christian and about Christian things you are a part of
- When you see them in need, tell them you will be praying for them (actually do it!!!)
- Invite them to an event, worship, or study with excitement and confidence
- Pray for them and listen to the Holy Spirit

So, the question now becomes, are you “IN?”

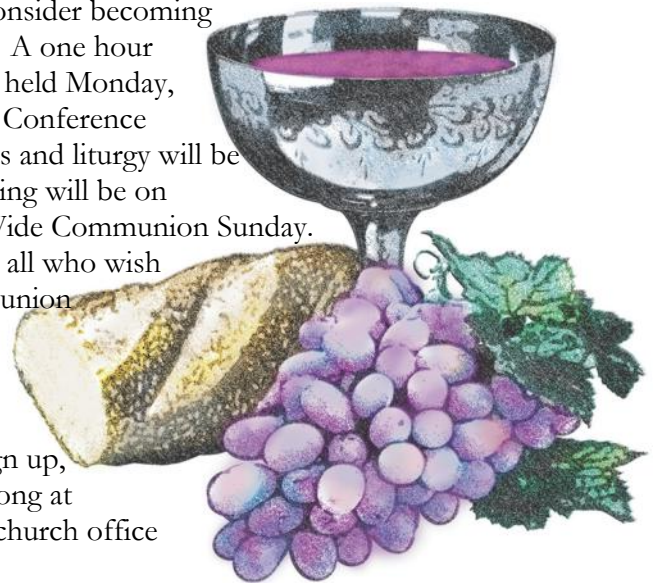

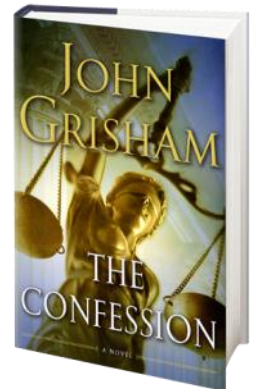
