





Summer Pastor's Study





To all the parent and adult leaders:

Thank you so much for your support of Benton United Methodist Church, and our Student Ministry for students grades 6-12, "In" Student Ministries. The past three years have been wonderful for me and my family; and we are looking forward to even greater things in the 2012-2013 school year. I wanted to let you know what our vision and goals are for the upcoming year, and what role YOU play in making them happen. First, here is our mission statement, which sums up why we do what we do:

IN Student Ministries exists to:

INvite others into our church and a relationship with Jesus Christ, INcounter God through worship, INcrease our knowledge of His Word, the Holy Scriptures, INgage in ministry with each other, our church, our community, and our world, and INteract with each other in love.

Next, here is our programming schedule, beginning Sunday, August 19th, which shows *how* we do what we do:

- Sunday Morning Worship at 8:30 AM or 10:50 AM, with Sunday School
- (Separate classes for Confirmation, Middle School, & High School) at 9:45 AM INcrease
- Sunday Night Small Groups at Chris and Kim's house (Separate groups for Middle School & High School) 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Sundays at 6:00 PM *INteract* Sunday Night Sports (On the field or in the Family Life Center) 4th Sundays at 6:00 PM *INvite IN*counter Student Worship Wednesdays at 6:00 PM (Snack Bar opens at 5:30) *IN*counter Monthly service opportunities (Food pantry, clothes closet, etc...) and yearly events
- (30 Hour Famine, Red-Bird Mission, Impact Benton, etc...) **INgage**

Now, here is where you come in. In order for a ministry to succeed, there are three crucial elements: First, is the presence of God. I'm asking our congregation, especially parents of students, to pray at least once per week for our student ministry. Second, is having leadership from adults. Whether it's leading a small group, driving for an event, or providing snacks, your participation is crucial. There will be opportunities to serve on a consistent basis, so please consider what your role could be. Third, we need the students. I know my family's life can be hectic with three children and both Kim and I working, so I can't imagine how crazy it is having teenagers. But I would ask you to set aside time each week for God, in your life and the life of your child. I'm not saying be here "every time the doors are open," but consistent attendance and participation in the student ministry will benefit your child and your family tremendously because one of the greatest ways we grow in, and live out, our Christian faith is through the Church. One of my biggest hopes for our ministry is that the students will not "graduate from God when they graduate high school." I want to see them go into college, their career, and the rest of their lives with a strong walk with Jesus Christ that will carry them through life's challenges. That

foundation is being laid now in their formative years. So, please do everything you can to encourage your student to participate regularly in the Student Ministry here at Benton United Methodist Church.

I SAW THE SIGN...

I first went to South Africa in July of 2001. Our team worked in Orange Tree township on a Methodist church in need of repairs. We formed a wonderful relationship with the members and the people of the town as we worked side by side rebuilding chairs, pouring concrete for a new room, erecting a cross, making candles and helping to sew quilts to support their ministry.

One of the days we were there we went to help serve tea and buttered bread to the pensioners who stood in line for many hours waiting for their meager allowances. This was a ministry of this church who cared for the poorest of the poor. The building where we worked was surrounded by armed guards who were there to protect those receiving cash from being robbed. It was a surreal experience as I reflected on living in the lap of luxury in the USA.

Below is a sign that was posted on the front doors of the church. It was large enough that anyone approaching could see from a distance. I came across this notice the other day as I was going through tons of paper that needed to be shredded and disposed of. This however will never be forgotten or laid aside, for it is the story of the church, the story of our church, the church that came into being on the day of Pentecost and lives and breathes and has as its purpose to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Let's get radical! *~Dianne*

NOTICE:

"Attention! Behind these doors we worship regularly with liars, thieves, gossips, backbiters, people with troubled marriages, alcoholics and drug takers.

We welcome hypocrites and jealous, envious, coveting, Materialistic sinners of all sizes, shapes and colors."

But the Good News is that we all have something in common. We have all learned that the Church, the body of Christ, is a hospital for sinners, not a museum for saints. We have all learned that the Lord is our rest, that He reaches out to save us, and that we are the redeemed community of the saints."

"We come here to worship and to praise Him, and to continually plan how we might be better agents of change, salt and light In a darkened world that needs the good news that Jesus saves.

You are welcome, but be warned that we take

Christianity seriously!"

Souper Saturday Needs YOU!

An opportunity to serve the community is available through our Souper Saturday Ministry. It is a ministry born out of the need to fill in for the Council on Aging's Meals on Wheels program by providing a hot meal on weekends. Several area churches cooperate in sharing this ministry be each taking a weekend to cook and deliver meals. Benton UMC delivers meals on the *last* Saturday of each month.

Church members volunteer to prepare, assemble, and deliver the meals out of the Family Life Center kitchen facility. Meals are delivered to the Benton area and as far north as Plain Dealing and its surrounding community.

It is completely financed by donations of time and money and does not come out of the church budget. Currently there is a need for servants on all levels.

Food Pantry Update & Invitation to Serve in Benton UMC Outreach...

Thanks to all of those who have helped with the food pantry whether it's taping boxes together, unloading the truck when it arrives, filling the boxes with food, signing people in when they arrive for their boxes, or actually distributing the boxes. Your help is greatly appreciated and we could not continue to sustain this ministry without all of you. This ministry is rapidly growing and we need more people to lead in the following areas:

*Leadership Positions Needed

- ◆ USDA Pantry Director Rachel Stoneman currently oversees the administrative and logistical aspects of the USDA food pantry. Each area will have a person that reports directly to the director.
- ♦ Emergency Pantry Director Rachel Stoneman currently oversees the administrative and logistical aspects of the Emergency food pantry. Each area will have a person that reports directly to the director.
- ◆ Administrator to USDA Connie Wasson currently supervises the administrative portion of the USDA food pantry and will report to the USDA Director.
- USDA Order & Packaging* Supervises the ordering and packaging
 of the USDA food pantry and works with Connie Wasson and Rachel
 Stoneman to ensure accurate counts of items needed for distribution.
- Pantry Organizer Ginny Jones currently organizes the pantry to ensure USDA and Emergency food box items remain separate, ensures that the pantry remains clean, assembles emergency food boxes and reports low inventory levels to Emergency and USDA Pantry Directors.
- ◆ Servant Coordinator* Schedules office servants to handle incoming assistance requests 2 days a week, notifying office personnel of the schedule and ensuring servant positions are filled.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 13TH AT 6:00 P.M. IN THE FAMILY LIFE WORSHIP CENTER

Our speaker for this "conversation" will be Dr. Patricia Bates, an ordained deacon in the United Methodist Church. She serves on the Louisiana Conference UMC Board of Church and Society as chair of restorative justice. She founded Seeds of Light, a restorative justice nonprofit ministry which received a Governor's Award for Excellence. She has served Wesley Chapel UMC in Homer as its Minister of Christian Education since 2004.

Dr. Bates will share valuable information with us about the signs of abusive relationships and the help that is available for victims. It is important for us who love our families and our neighbors to be aware of these signs.

Since this is a "conversation" we want you to ask questions and share with each other. This meeting is open to all adults and high school students. Our discussion will not be appropriate for younger children. The nursery will be open for children 5 years old or younger.


